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The following is a list of requirements for the erection or use of a temporary structure for the seasonal sale of fireworks.

PERMITS

- A building permit shall be obtained prior to the erection of any temporary structure.
- An electrical permit shall be obtained for any temporary power service.
- Documents required to obtain the building permit include: site plan in compliance with the separation distances listed below; floor plan showing layout of display fixtures, locations of exits, locations of exit signs and fire extinguisher locations; manufacturer's flame spread certificate for the tent.

SEPARATION

The following minimum separation distances shall be maintained from the facility:

- 50' from bulk fuel dispensing.
- 20' from other buildings.
- 20' from other tents.
- 20' from dry grass or brush or combustible debris.
- 20' from storage areas.
- 10' from parking areas.
- 50' from portable generators.

SIGNAGE

- At least one sign that reads as follows shall be posted at each entrance-
"FIREWORKS – NO SMOKING"- Letters shall be at least 2" high on contrasting background.
- At least one sign that reads as follows shall be posted on the exterior of each side of the facility-
"NO FIREWORKS DISCHARGE WITHIN 300 FEET"-Letters shall be at least 4" high on contrasting background.

DISPLAY

- Fireworks shall be packaged or covered fuse type only.
- Displays shall be a maximum of six (6) feet in height measured from the floor upwards.
- Flame breaks shall be provided at a maximum interval of 32' along the display. These flame breaks shall extend at least 6" above the fireworks and shall be the full depth of the display.

EGRESS

- A minimum of three exists at least 44" wide shall be provided.
- Exit signs shall be marked by an approved exit sign.
- Aisles shall be a minimum of 48" wide.
- Exits shall be located such that the maximum travel distance to an exit does not exceed 35'.
- Sales area shall have a minimum of two exits.
- The means of egress, including the exit discharge, shall be illuminated if the facility is open for business after dusk.

FIRE PROTECTION

- Provide (1) class 2-A portable fire extinguisher and (1) water based fire extinguisher per 75 feet of travel distance.

***NOTICE:** Commencing construction activities without required permits will result in a \$500.00 fee in accordance with KRS 109.2.
